



- 1) Press the clear tabs for the pot to open for wrapping a branch and remove black cap.
- 2) Before placing pot around a branch, make a circle-cut and peel the bark about 1/3 inch to promote root growth. Rooting hormone can be used.
- 3) Clip pot closed securely around branch.
- 4) Gently press soil or damp moss in top reservoir, filling pot.
- 5) Wrap the post with black label enclosed. Place the black pot-lid on top of the pot, centered around the branch. It prevents evaporation, which condensates under the lid and funnels back to the soil. Pot increases inside temperature several degrees since it is nearly sealed.

- 6) Irrigate abundantly to fill the two water reservoirs and to compress the soil closely to join the soil and branch. The water will go up by capillary force, moisturizing the same degree all the time. You only need to check the water level occasionally adding water when low.
- 7) Wait 2-4 months, depending on the variety and the local climate, before harvesting. You may open the Rooter-Pot® carefully in order to check the growing root progress.
- 8) When your roots have grown sufficiently. Cut your start with the pot from the mother plant and replant into a big pot or finished planting. Your start may need pruning to balance aerial and root parts.
